 - Unwillingness to commit on an ongoing basis
 - Language barriers
 - Perception that their voice will not be heard
- O What can be done to support engagement?
 - Suggestions from council:
 - Topic based involvement via website (no need to attend)
 - Increased communication from school/council on meetings
 - Increased visibility into lack of representation from community and certain classes
 - Improve perception; all voices heard
 - Explore childcare possibility/feasibility
 - Attendance does not have to be ongoing

3. Update from the Teacher Rep (10)

Shayna Carson

Vision and Mission Team: All staff, students and parents are all an essential part of developing our mission and vision. To give all our students a voice (build ownership and commitment), we are working on a variety of activities where every student will be given the opportunity to answer the following two questions:

What do you love about CMPS? What are the hopes and dreams that you have while you are at CMPS?

*different forms- writing on small cards, graffiti activities on chart paper, students drawing pictures and describing them, etc.

Kinder Team:

- All of our Kinders went to Miller's Farm last week. Curriculum focus was on community and farm to table living.
- Daily our kinder students are outside exploring: currently exploring the changes in nature, using objects found on the ground in Math on their 10frames, and are in discussion on the rabbit holes and how the rabbits are going to survive the winter months
- Remembrance Service: they all gather outside to come together and honour the day. Many read alouds and activities have been completed prior to this day

Grade 5's: Last week all grade 5 classes went to Parliament to visit the house of commons as well as the senate (currently learning about Canadian Government and Elections).

Grade 2's: Travel days begin next week. Each month the grade 2 classes do Social Study rotations, where the classes come together to learn about countries/continents around the world. The first continent they will be focusing on is Africa. The rotations consist of a variety of activities such as a whole grade dance, craft, read aloud, collaborative mural (visual arts), etc.

Sports, Clubs and Other

Ukulele club: Grade 3's to begin first week of November 1. Students will meet 1 recess a week for ukulele instruction. Their first goal is to perform something at the Christmas assembly. Ukulele club for grade 2 students, will begin in the new year.

Sports: All teams are made based on commitment during intramurals, responsibility in the classroom, cooperation during practices, etc. Intramurals took place for 4 weeks, allowing most students lots of opportunities to participate and have a good season. Teams practice for an additional 2 weeks prior to a tournament.
