Sports

Clubs

Mrs. Kim has started Grade 1 choir and they meet 1X per week.

ChoralFest was Wednesday, April 17th. 10 schools from the OCDSB got to attend. Students were able to attend workshops under the leadership of Jackie Hawley who is an acclaimed Choral director. It's a day of musical enrichment that culminates in a choir showcase for families and friends.

Chess club continues to meet until the end of April.

Classroom

Grade 1s will be having Scientists in the School over the next couple of weeks to explore a unit on Energy.

Grade 4s had their early societies open house last week with parents and 4 classes walking through to see their dioramas (now on display in library).

Gr.6 students have been studying space and doing many small independent projects. The space walk allowed students to showcase their learning by sharing what they have learned with their peers and students from grade 1-5. Students became the teachers!

Grade 3s are participating in Swim to Survive - they each get 3 lessons and the lessons are currently underway.

Education Week is coming up May 6th-10th. Classes are preparing to showcase their learning in a variety of ways.

Library Update - We have successfully read all the books that were purchased from the Forest of reading - Le Prix Peuplier reading program and The Blue Spruce Award™ program. The programs celebrate Canadian books, publishers, authors and illustrators. They promote reading for enjoyment and begin to develop a child's skill in evaluating a picture book based on story, text and pictures.

All the books were well received and enjoyed by our students from Grade 1-3. A big thank you to School Council for supporting this. We would like to continue receiving this support every year!

Musical

Musical tickets went on sale this week. They are being sold on a first come, first serve basis. Show is Wednesday, May 1st and Thursday, May 2nd both shows are at 6:30pm.

Students are in the last two weeks of morning rehearsals before the tech, dress rehearsal and performance week. Prop and set crew are designing set backdrops.

Stage choir has been rehearsing at recesses and will be joining the morning rehearsals next week.

Ticket sales started this week, order forms went home and parents can choose which night and how many tickets are needed. They are \$5 each. There will be a performance on Wed afternoon for all students (no parents/families are permitted at this performance). Ticket sales will only continue via order forms until Friday April 26 or if we sell out before then. If not sold out, a limited number of tickets will be available at the door.

Kindergarten

Kinders had lots of fun with Yaki.

We will be going to the Agricultural Museum May 6, 8, 10th. (2 classes per day) We will be taking part in the "Chill Out" workshop making ice cream.

Lastly Monday May 27th, the kinders will be involved in several different workshops through Maker Space from UOttawa.
